TOP 10 KEY LEARNINGS, ANNOUNCEMENTS, & QUOTES

- 1. Compete on value not price. Terry Watson
- 2. Telling people to "calm down" or "relax" has the opposite effect. Terry Watson
- 3. Compensation NOT commission.
- 4. If you're going to file a TREC complaint, you need to own it. Don't put TREC in the middle for "squabbles".
- 5. Not all education is "good" education.
- 6. Buyer/rep forces us to explain our value upfront.
- 7. There's been a shift away from core competencies.
- 8. Agents need permission to record (in a listing for social media) from the seller and listing broker.
- 9. New agents aren't at the highest risk of getting sued. Agents licensed for 7 years (on average) are the greatest risk.
- **10.** Protect your mindset before speaking on camera and resist the urge to ask for forgiveness if you are nervous.

I am extremely grateful I had the opportunity to attend the 2024 Winter Meeting and represent CCAR. It is a *long* trip but I always come home with more knowledge and stronger relationships, and I hope the stories we share with other members make them want to attend with us next year.
