2025 Legislative Meetings Washington, D.C.

The 2025 NAR Legislative Meetings in Washington, D.C., provided an incredible opportunity to engage with REALTOR leaders from across the country, gain insight into the future of our industry, and advocate on behalf of our members at the federal level.

On Sunday, I attended the C2EX (Commitment to Excellence) meeting. We discussed boosting engagement and encouraging REALTORS to register and complete the endorsement process. I also attended the Advocacy Scoop, a live taping highlighting REALTOR advocacy efforts. That evening, I networked with colleagues from across Texas and other states.

Monday's General Session featured political analysts Scott Jennings and Juan Williams, moderated by Sarah Lipnitz. Their discussion emphasized bipartisan collaboration, and I especially appreciated Jennings note that colleagues on opposing sides of the aisle often work together behind the scenes. In the RPAC Participation meeting, Texas was praised for its leadership in member engagement strategies. I also attended the MLS Listing Service Forum for updates on industry trends. That evening, I was honored to walk the stage at the RPAC Hall of Fame Ceremony for reaching the \$25,000 investment milestone, followed by a celebration dinner with Collin County Area REALTORS.

Tuesday began with Dr. Lawrence Yun at the Residential Economic Issues & Trends Forum. He remains hopeful that interest rates will decline. Senior housing was a key issue affordability and poor options are keeping seniors in their homes and reducing inventory. At the RPAC Fundraising & Advocacy Class, our TREPAC Purple Store was a highlight, serving as inspiration for other states. That night, I joined Texas leaders for the TREPAC and PIC Dinner to prepare for Wednesday's Hill visits.

On Wednesday, I met with Congressmen Keith Self, Jake Elzey, Pat Fallon, and Pete Sessions to discuss REALTOR legislative priorities. These conversations were productive and helped reinforce our message. Later, the Region 10 Caucus representing Texas and Louisiana provided important regional updates.

The meetings wrapped up Thursday with the NAR Board of Directors Meeting, where key decisions were made that will shape the future of the REALTOR industry. It was a powerful reminder of the importance of leadership and staying engaged.

These Legislative Meetings reinforced how REALTORS can make a difference when we show up, speak up, and work together from advocacy to education and everything in between.
